You can Save a Life!

Help Make Narcan Accessible

Please consider placing of a Narcan “box” at your facility (store, restaurant or other public building). Narcan can quickly restore normal respiration to a person whose breathing has slowed or stopped due to overdosing with an opioid such as heroin or prescription medications. It is simple to administer, it cannot be abused and it is completely safe.

Think of the Narcan box as similar to the automatic defibrillators you see in public places.

The size of the box is approximately 7-3/4" h x 6-3/8" w x 3-5/8" d.

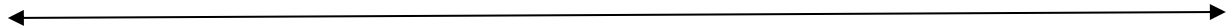


New York State law exempts you as the business owner from liability associated with placement of a Narcan box. Also exempted from liability is a person who administers, in good faith, Narcan to someone who has overdosed.

The Narcan box can be installed by us under your direction if desired. We will also provide a local volunteer to maintain

the box as needed. ***There is no cost to you***, ever. In the next six months, Mountain Top Care Coalition (MCC) plans to roll out a multi-faceted campaign to promote awareness of Narcan and to train people to use it. Together with law enforcement, EMT's, health care providers and others, we can make a difference and help those with opioid use disorder recover and reclaim their lives.
